MOAPPP's 15th Annual Conference is May 4-5, 2006. The conference brings together over 400 health and social service providers, educators, advocates, and managers who work to prevent adolescent pregnancy and support pregnant and parenting adolescents. The conference offers a variety of keynote speakers and workshops that focus on a broad range of topics related to teen pregnancy prevention and adolescent parents. **We invite you to submit a workshop proposal for this year's conference.**

MOAPPP seeks presentations that are informative, engaging and grounded in what we know works in teen pregnancy prevention and teen parent support. We hope to challenge, motivate, and inspire participants in their work with youth and families. We welcome the inclusion of youth presenters who are active leaders or advocates in their community, and are comfortable addressing a professional audience.

Workshop sessions are 1 hour and 15 minutes long. The goals of the workshops are to:

- Impart new information that improves capacity to provide effective services and programs.
- Share strategies and innovative programs that use science-based approaches.
- Provide skills that enhance professional competency.
- Highlight specific approaches to working with youth at greatest risk of pregnancy.

New this year - Showcase of Local Programs: There will be a number of sessions that showcase strong school or community-based programs throughout Minnesota. Presenters will have 25 minutes to make a presentation about their program and respond to questions from participants. Each session will highlight two to three local initiatives.
