MOAPPP's 16th Annual Conference is May 3-4, 2007. The conference brings together over 400 health and social service providers, educators, advocates, and managers who work to prevent adolescent pregnancy and support pregnant and parenting adolescents. The conference offers a variety of keynote speakers and workshops that focus on a broad range of topics related to teen pregnancy prevention and adolescent parents. **We invite you to submit a workshop proposal for this year's conference.**

MOAPPP seeks presentations that are informative, engaging and grounded in what we know works in teen pregnancy prevention and teen parent support. We hope to challenge, motivate, and inspire participants in their work with youth and families. We welcome the inclusion of youth presenters who are active leaders or advocates in their community, and are comfortable addressing a professional audience. We are most interested in highly interactive presentations that combine theory with practical applications.

How to Submit a Proposal:

Deadline: The deadline for receipt of proposals is **Friday, November 17, 2006**. All proposals will be acknowledged, and selected presenters will be notified no later than December 15, 2006.

Instructions: Please send a proposal that includes all of the information listed below.

- Presenter Information**
 - Include: **Name, Title, Agency, Address, Phone, and Email** for all presenters.
 - If there is more than one speaker, please indicate the key contact person.
- Workshop Title**
- Brief workshop summary** (no more than 100 words). If your proposal is accepted, this description will be edited and included in the conference materials.
- Learning Objectives:** List two to three learning objectives you want your audience to have met when they leave your session.
- Workshop Description:** Write a description of your workshop that answers the following questions:
 - Focus: What is the focus of the workshop?
 - Theoretical Framework: Does the workshop reflect a science-based approach?
 - Target Population: Who is the target population? Does the workshop specifically address the needs of teens at highest risk of pregnancy?
 - Teaching Methods: How you will present the material, e.g., didactic, experiential, small group activities?
