Tell MOAPPP what it means to be a healthy young person

Here's an opportunity for young people, ages 13 to 24, to create and submit video public service announcements to MOAPPP that respond to the question: "what does it mean to be a healthy young person today?"

Why would I want to do this? Because this is an opportunity to

- create a video on a topic that affects everyone
- impress yourself, your family, friends, teachers, school/college, potential employers, faith or community organization, and many others
- gain recognition by MOAPPP, a respected statewide leader
- meet cool people who promote adolescent sexual health
- compete to win one of several prizes

Submission rules:

- All entries must be received by March 31, 2010.
- Maximum video length: 60 seconds (30 to 45 seconds is optimal).
- Videos must respond to the question: "what does it mean to be a healthy young person today?" and focus on an area of adolescent sexual health such as: healthy relationships, pregnancy prevention, STDs, HIV/AIDS, teen parenting.
- Videos must not contain:
 - material that violates or infringes another's rights, including but not limited to privacy, publicity or intellectual property rights, or that constitutes copyright or license infringement.
 - brand names or trademarks
 - material that is inappropriate
 - material that is unlawful, in violation of or contrary to the laws or regulations in any state where the videos are created.
- All videos submitted become the property of MOAPPP and MOAPPP reserves the right to use submitted videos in its media and publications.
- Release forms will be provided and must be completed and signed by all participants who appear in your video(s). This includes voice-over participants. Persons under age 18 must have parent/legal guardian permission.
- Videos must be created by persons who live in/are connected to Minnesota and are between the ages of 13 and 24

Submission process:

- Upload videos to YouTube
- Email the link to your video to sally@moapp.org along with the names of the people who worked on/appear in the video, name of contact person and that person's telephone number, and your affiliation (e.g. school, community organization).
- Save your original video. The selected videos will be shown at the MOAPPP Annual Conference on May 7, 2010.
